


SANTA FE SCHOOL OF COOKING

Located downtown in the heart of beautiful Santa Fe, NM, the Santa Fe School of Cooking is an internationally acclaimed, recreational culinary school and Market, specializing in foods of the American Southwest for over 35 years.

GEORGIA O'KEEFFE MUSEUM

The Georgia O'Keeffe Museum comprises intentionally curated galleries to guide visitors through the inspiring and bold world of Georgia O'Keeffe. Follow the galleries through O'Keeffe's early work as a student and teacher, groundbreaking paintings from her time living on the East Coast and her artistic revelations from her time in New Mexico. Average viewing time is 60 minutes but visitors may stay as long as they wish.



RIO RAFTING ADVENTURES

This five-mile section known as the Racecourse is our most popular half-day trip on the Rio Grande. Ranging from a wild class III-IV ride during the spring high-water to a more technical and demanding class III run as the water goes down and the rocks come up in summer. In May and June, be prepared for cold water, big waves, and plenty of interactive excitement. Your guide will be depending on you to help maneuver and power the raft through many tight spots and narrow channels. With the lower water comes warmer water, allowing for more opportunities to jump in and go swimming, and surfing the raft in the waves.



PLAZA AND DOWNTOWN

Spend some time in the original city center! From the historic Plaza to the oldest church in the United States to the Palace of the Governors, downtown Santa Fe is full of stories and classic architecture, much of which is now inhabited by eclectic restaurants, galleries, boutiques, bookstores, museums, and world-class hotels. Walk along the Santa Fe River, peek in on the unique New Mexico State Capitol—the only circular state capitol building in the United States—known as the Roundhouse, and take a tour of the New Mexico Capitol Art Collection. Be sure to visit the Georgia O'Keeffe Museum, a testament to the 20th century artist's enchantment with Northern New Mexico, and Santa Fe's with her.

Sena Plaza: Named after the original owners, this historic courtyard still features its enchanting hacienda, now a restaurant called La Casa Sena, as well as shops and a beautiful garden. If you like jazz, check out Club Legato.

New Mexico Museum of Art: Opened in 1917, the state's first building dedicated to art. Marvel at the Pueblo-Revival style and wander the many exhibitions.




THE RAILYARD

The Railyard has emerged as Santa Fe's epicenter for diverse local markets, live entertainment, gallery openings and artist talks, as well as free community events. Come experience why the Santa Fe Railyard has become the place to celebrate, engage, and be entertained.

With the revitalization of the Railyard nearly complete, existing studios, galleries, museums and community organizations are now joined by a year-round structure for the Santa Fe Farmers Market, a brand new home for teen center Warehouse 21, dynamic new retail and restaurant spaces in the new Market Station complex, live-in artist studios, and the addition of a state-of-the-art 12-screen movie theatre.
